There are two basic issues when teaching (and learning) in a non-native language, particularly at university level where the content is invariably complex. The first is to recognise that the methodology of teacher-fronted transmission mode (lecturing) must be modified to take into account the new conditions. The second is to extend the methodological repertoires of the teachers to include a wider range of delivery formats.

Nevertheless, in both cases, the job of the teacher is to guide input (reading and audio-visual) and to support output (spoken and written). Finally, without output, we cannot know if our students are really benefitting, and neither can they.
